## From The Reverends Nowak

### *"What does this mean?"*

Ah, that famous question from the Small Catechism of Martin Luther. Following this question we know there will be a more lengthy explanation of a commandment, petition of the Lord's Prayer, or creed. More lengthy, but also more helpful; clarifying what these ancient writings mean to us who are now living in the light and life of the resurrected Christ many, many years later. (Even though Luther's work is now roughly 500 years old!)

*What is this? So what? What difference does it make?* This is the lens through which we should look at all scripture. Telling stories of the past and remembering together as a Christian community is cool, but...so what? What difference does it make, really? What difference does it make that Jesus was tempted by Satan in the wilderness? What differences does it make that Jesus talked with a Samaritan woman at a well? What differences does it make that Lazarus was raised from the dead?

I think we can all agree that these make pretty cool stories, but...so what?

In our preaching for Lent this year, we hope to be like Martin Luther and dive into the answer to, "What does this mean?" for the Gospel readings. Each week until Palm Sunday, the Gospel readings can be seen as stories of great change, and ultimately the change is a gift from God in all cases. Before we get to the great change of resurrection at Easter, we'll look at all of these other blessings of change from God and what difference these can make to us today. Perhaps God is calling you to change or be changed in some way? Or perhaps all of us as a community? The important thing is not to run from the change, but towards it, knowing that is where we will find our Beloved Savior. You may ask yourself: *What does this mean?* Luckily, you're not alone in answering that question. We've got this together!

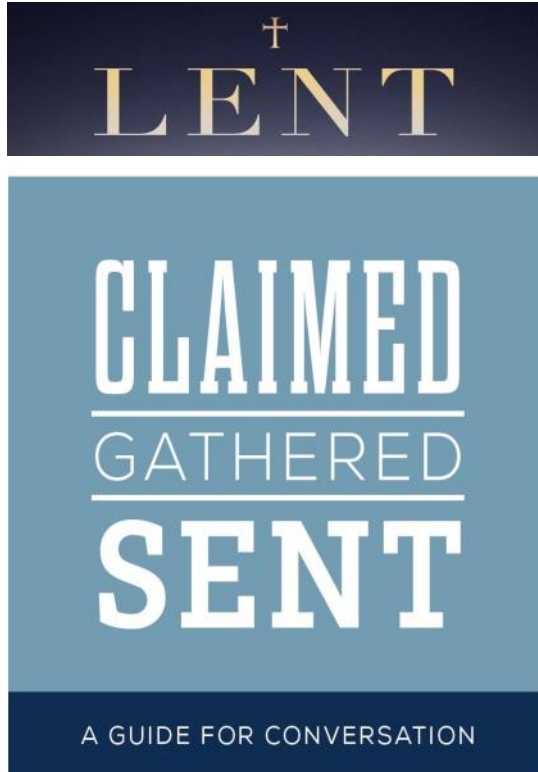

Join us on March 1<sup>st</sup> as Pastor Sarah leads us into Lent by baking Communion Bread for our intergenerational meeting in March. “Lent” originally was a secular word with its origins traced to an Old English word *lencten* related to “lengthen”. It referred to the lengthening of days, which simply was the season of spring. Time to be penitent in the church fell during the springtime in Europe and “Lent” became synonymous with this time. The official Latin title was “*quadragesima*” which literally translated to the “40<sup>th</sup> day”. This 40 days before Easter was the period of preparation before Jesus’s Passion, death and resurrection. Considering these words let us remember that Lent is a time of spiritual renewal. And we are inviting you to begin the season by baking the bread which symbolizes love and grace in Communion with the Lord.
