

### **Sacrificial Giving & Works of Love**

"Friends in Christ, today with the whole church we enter the time of remembering Jesus' passover from death to life, and our life in Christ is renewed.

We begin this holy season by acknowledging our need for repentance and for God's mercy. We are created to experience joy in communion with God, to love one another, and to live in harmony with creation. But our sinful rebellion separates us from God, our neighbors, and creation, so that we do not enjoy the life our creator intended.

As disciples of Jesus, we are called to a discipline that contends against evil and resists whatever leads us away from love of God and neighbor. I invite you, therefore, to the discipline of Lent—self-examination and repentance, prayer and fasting, sacrificial giving and works of love—strengthened by the gifts of word and sacrament. Let us continue our journey through these forty days to the great Three Days of Jesus' death and resurrection."



This "Invitation to Lent" is traditionally read on Ash Wednesday to remind those gathered in worship what this season that we are entering into together is all about – to take some time to re-direct our thinking away from ourselves and, instead, on the ways that God wishes we would think, live, and act. Often during Lent, folks, Lutheran included, pick something to give up for the season to "help" then with this task. Others, try to add something – extra Bible reading, prayer time, or reading an extra daily devotion – to their lives to help keep the focus of this season.

This year, we're inviting you into a congregational Lenten disciple. A few pages away in this newsletter you'll find some words and information from Kathy Henkel explaining that we will be creating Personal Care Kits for Lutheran World Relief together. You are invited to bring donations to the church until Palm Sunday, when we will build the kits; bless them in our Eater worship, and then send them out into the world to help our siblings in need. We didn't know, when we were in the planning stages of this project, that there would be a war going on in Ukraine, and Lutheran World Relief would be helping at the boarder with

humanitarian aid. That is exactly the kind of place where our kits will go. So, this Lent, you all are invited to focus on the "Sacrificial Giving and Worlds of Love" part of this invitation especially, and be part of this effort to help our global neighbors.

# President's Note Jennifer Morlan Horner

Many of us enter the Lenten season feeling anxious and heart-broken over Russia's invasion of Ukraine. The updates are grim: from 1 to 5 million people are expected to be displaced and seeking safety. Already hundreds of civilians, including children, have been killed. Even more upsetting are the unknowns. Will Putin stop in Ukraine? How will the U.S. and the rest of the world respond? How will our friends and family members in the military be affected? How will the U.S. economy be impacted?

Also weighing on me is the feeling of uselessness. My typical Lenten ritual of giving up a favorite food or leisure pastime feels frivolous. Making a financial donation to help relief organizations deal with the impending refugee crisis, while important, doesn't feel like enough. I realize that much of the feelings of impotence are caused by thinking of what I can do by myself.

But when I am with my Pleasant View family – and our worldwide church family – I feel emboldened. I know that together we can make a difference. We might not be the ones delivering aid, but we can help replenish the supplies. Maybe we can't help house a Ukrainian refugee family, but perhaps we will renew our efforts to help refugees through Exodus. We can continue to support the advocacy of groups such as Bread for the World to ensure systems are in place to help feed the hungry who will be affected by the war. And we can educate ourselves on what is happening. I recommend keeping up to date with <a href="Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service">Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service</a>, which offers action steps we can take individually or as a congregation.

And we can pray:

A Prayer of Christian Faith for Ukraine

O Lord, God of life, as you care for all creation, give us your peace. May our security come not from weapons, but from respect. May our strength come not from violence, but from love. May our own wealth come not from money, but from sharing. May our path not be one of ambition, but of justice. May our victory not be one of revenge, but of forgiveness. Unarmed and confident, help us to defend the dignity of all creation. Sharing today and always the bread of solidarity and peace. Amen.

# PERSONAL CARE KITS

#### SOME IMPORTANT GUIDELINES TO REMEMBER

- Be sure to shop for light- or medium-weight towels, which are easier for Kit recipients to hand wash and air dry, take up less storage space and are considerably less expensive than the fluffier towels we may prefer to use.
- Bath towels vary in size. The 52" X 27" size listed in the guidelines is the maximum size. 20" x 40" is a good guideline for a minimum size.
- · Please give new items only.
- Please do not donate items with any religious symbols, messages or your group's name.
- Please do not donate any items decorated with a U.S. flag, patriotic or military symbols, or references to the armed forces, including camouflage.
- . Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed.
- · All items should be new and in good condition.
- Do not enclose the Kit or any of its contents in plastic bags.

#### INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING IN EACH PERSONAL CARE KIT

- ONE light-weight bath-size towel (between 20" x 40" and 52" x 27"), dark color recommended
- TWO or three bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping
- ONE adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging\*
- ONE sturdy comb, remove packaging
- ONE metal nail clippers (attached file optional), remove packaging
- Toothbrush multi-packs may be used by sealing an individual toothbrush in a business-size envelope; no plastic bags or wrap

#### **HOW TO PACK YOUR PROJECT PROMISE KITS**

- Fold the towel in half. Place the rest of the items in the towel, fold and roll so nothing falls out, and secure with yarn, ribbon, string or rubber bands.
- Pack completed Kits, like items together, in boxes.
   Label contents in LARGE, BLOCK LETTERS on the outside of the boxes.
- Use strong cartons secured with packing tape, not to exceed 40 pounds.
- · Do not use plastic or paper bags to pack donations.
- Include the name and address of your group or congregation on each box and label the contents
