We are quite excited (or maybe just Pastor Sarah is!) to have a new hymnal to play with and begin to use when it is fitting; filled with updates to the liturgy, new prayers, and new songs to learn and love. We're glad to have another resource to refresh and bring new life into our worship as we enter this Easter Season. And, as the world around us wakes up from long winter naps, and we all begin to slowly come out of our year-long, love-driven social hibernation, we can embrace this blossoming world more fully than just watching from the windows as so many of us did last year.

But, again, during this time we eat not only with the congregation of gathered people and the Communion of Saints across all time and space, but also among the congregation of all of creation worshipping with us—the grass, the birds, the cars driving by, the dogs barking, all of it!

When we gather in creation, and when we wander out into it on our own, we are indeed far from alone, and it is far from barren—it is singing! Worship will continue to be different... but that's how it's supposed to be anyway! May we move into the new life that God is leading us into with joy and the enthusiasm to embrace the new!

Greetings fellow PVLC-ers,

I could never be a newspaper feature writer. Last month's newsletter was the time for a "one year of the pandemic" piece. But I'm not good at

writing about such an anniversary ahead of time so please allow me to reflect on a year of Covid now.

Looking back on the past year, it has been a unique one. Everyone has adjusted differently. Some do fine with online Sunday worship, some not so fine. Some churches have been starting and stopping (and re-starting, etc) indoor worship, but we've remained consistent.

When I think about limiting social contacts, one thing I've thought about recently is what the Indiana Dept of Health said last summer – that limiting COVID-19 spread makes it easier to get kids back in school. I'm afraid we really don't know yet how much the lack of in-person school has affected our youth. As schools try to get back to at least four days in person, I keep that in mind when deciding how much social contact is important to me.

One great thing about remote or recorded worship is that it makes it very easy to try out some worship services you may not have otherwise. I've been pretty regular at PVLC online services, but not everyone's service is at 10 am Eastern! I may not recall each one, but besides Lutheran services, I've attended virtual or recorded services from at least four other faiths, in at least four states.

Another plus from the pandemic has been fewer knocks on the door from various religious groups to which I have to say, "Thanks for stopping by. I'm happy with my faith life!" Let me close with an example of a good communication from one of those groups. We recently received a handwritten letter via good old US Mail from a group that usually goes door-to-door. I almost just threw it out but thought, someone took the time to write this by hand, I will read it. And I'm glad I did. It quoted a few passages about hygiene from Leviticus and Deuteronomy (which are generally very good advice). Then it said, "The Israelites benefited by following the standards set out in God's laws. And we can benefit too... by wearing your mask, washing your hands, maintaining your distance." The did say they'd love to talk in the future, but ended quickly and simply with, "Stay safe and have a nice day." What a great way for this group to reach out and show me they love their neighbors!
