## **From The Reverends Nowak**



Waiting, waiting, and oh yeah, more waiting. This time of waiting to "go back to normal" doesn't seem to end, but continues to slowly drag on. There are a certainly glimmers of hope and change here and there, but the waiting just keeps going on. So what are we doing with it? Do we refuse to see this time as a part of our life story, an anomaly, a blip before the real story continues on? And, so do we just sit and wait for that to happen?

Well, around Pleasant View we're doing more than just sitting around and waiting. This time has been filled with finding new ways of meaningful connection with congregation and community members, reimagining what "church" is when we're not occupying the same space, and how we continue to be the hands and feet of Christ in new ways now and when this current time is past. We've also continued to care for our grounds and facility – with much work from our Custodian, Facilities Chair, and group members – and have even made some improvements!

Our pandemic-formed book group has been quite a bright spot as well, with new, more open relationships forming between members of our community who didn't talk with each other much before. And, in the book we just finished (*An Altar in the World* by Barbara Brown Taylor) the author even talks about waiting as a kind of prayer.

"Waiting is certainly a kind of prayer, especially if you can stand howling, wide-open spaces...I found it possible to love my life in ways that had never occurred to me before." (pg.183)

She then talks about all of the particular joys that can stand out to a person who is waiting for something important; ways of seeing what was always there around us in new ways, and how this altered vision of the world around us during these times can be a gift, an answer to a prayer for more to life, as we see the richness and depth of the life that we still have. And then life after a time of such waiting has been touched by that new experience that it can never really go back to how it was before.

God keeps making us new. Even when it feels like we are stuck in a time of waiting, like we're going nowhere, like nothing important is happening. In these times maybe we

need to pull the microscope out to see what God is up to, but even the microscopic creature are beloved by their Creator.
