

From Your Pastors

Wondering what in person worship is like these days? You're not alone!

Here's what's going on these days...

It's at 10am in the Sanctuary and masks are required.

It's been a while since we've been in the Sanctuary, and for some of us, even longer! We hear that worship in this space has been very formal in the past and only done in a certain way – please don't think of it like that now! The Sanctuary is just the room that this community has designated for worship, and as such it should be a place where we can all freely and comfortably worship. So please, come to worship as yourself and expect to be warmly welcomed as yourself!



We're working on making this room better work for all of us (a big thanks to all of the pew movers on July 25th!) There's now a place for kiddos to be kiddos in the room, some fresh new banners instead of paraments (and we hope to make new ones together in the future), and more space for different kinds of musicians to lead our community in our shared song, with other updates probably coming down the road.

Throughout the service there are chances to stand, sit, kneel, and walk to the front to receive Communion – these are all optional though! We don't all have to be doing the same thing. If kneeling is more meaningful to you during the confession, do it; there are padded kneelers in all of the pews for you to use. If you'd rather stand, do it! If sitting is best for your body, do it! The same goes when we are praying and singing. We may invite you to stand, sit, or kneel, but do what you need to, and try new things!

If you want to move around or clap to the music, go for it – maybe you'll inspire others to do as well!

Need to use the restroom or stretch your legs during the service (even during the Sermon)? It's ok! Go ahead, feel free to stretch/stand in the Narthex if that is more comfortable for you. The doors will remain open so you can still hear.

There will be times when you can help lead parts of the service, add your own prayers to our community's, and share life updates and joys – don't be afraid to speak up and add your voice!



From Your Pastors

Worried that your kids will be noisy? Yup, kids are sometimes, and so are adults! And you know what, we all know this already. No one will be surprised that your kid makes noise, nor will they be angry that they are during worship – that can't be controlled. And, yes,

adding a kids space to the room might actually make them noisier because they will want to talk to friends, but we'd rather have them in the room with all of us than not. And, of course, they don't have to sit in the kids area. They're free to sit with you, with a friend, or roam. If you really feel like your kid needs to leave the room for a bit, it's not necessary, but go ahead and take them to the Narthex or the Nursery if you must. But, please then come back in and keep trying.

Not sure you'll like the style and feel of how we are currently worshiping? Well, you won't know



until you try! And, the thing about what we're doing now is that it's a bit different every week; we're going to keep experimenting, adding new pieces, taking others away. You're probably going to like some things and not like others. That's ok. Remember that you're not the only one worshiping here, and let's celebrate and explore the diversity of worship styles within our community all together!

And, feel free to keep bringing food and diaper donations! Kathy Henkel continues to faithfully take food donations to local pantries regularly and takes whatever we have here with her as well. So, if this is a convenient way to share what you have with your neighbors, keep bringing food. We'll make sure that it gets to where it's needed! And, diapers are still welcome too! Bob and Margaret Stratford continue to take those donations to the Diaper Bank for us as well! All donations can be left in the basket in the Narthex.

Christian Education Update

- <u>Sunday Church School (SCS) will resume Sunday, September 12th!</u> This is the Sunday following Labor Day. A few important points about SCS:
 - As of July, SCS will be in-person.
 - SCS will follow 10:00 AM Sunday worship and will begin at 11:00 AM.
 - On the third Sunday of each month, we will have Inter-Generational SCS. All participants in SCS will meet in the Fellowship Hall on these days.
- Diaper donations continue to be accepted. There are several ways to donate, as follows:

- COVID-19 moving forward

- **Q:** How is In-person indoor service + Streaming doing?
- A: Audio could be better it echoes and gets garbled. Will try to put phone closer to pastors. Could buy an amplifier so that wifi reaches the sanctuary. May try a different microphone. Pastors ask council members to consider being the Zoom host during the service.
- **Q:** Ready for indoor mask choice? Optional for vaccinated people?
- A: Positivity rate rising and cases rising. Discussion of new variant, unvaccinated children, or other unvaccinated persons. Consensus is that for the care of others we should continue with wearing masks.

- LLC Update:

Pastors sent message to reduce rent which they have done. Pastor Lazdins is officially retired.

- Tenants Updates:

- ACH: Getting ready for school year, re-carpeting in classrooms and will store items in designated area of fellowship hall for a short time while work is done.
- **DBSA:** Monday evening going well and following guidelines
- AA: Saturday meetings going well and following guidelines
- ELCARM: Going well and following guidelines

All groups are happy to be back.

- **Q:** Requests for fellowship hall for private events what should our response be?
- A: Consensus is to let a member and groups we know use the building for a private event with the current Covid policies.
- **Q:** Do we want to impose a limit on persons?
- **A:** Yes, 60 people max in fellowship hall.

Committee's Report

A: Pastors' Report- Pr. Sarah N.

- Youth Gathering in 2023 at the end of July in Minneapolis. Info sent to youth. Timing iffy due to being right before school and college starts.
 Possibility of a Synod group for singles from several churches.
