#### A Resolution to be Less Resolute

Ah, once again we're in the season of new year's resolutions. When it is convenient to pick the beginning of a new calendar year as the time to drastically change something about yourself... and then not follow through.

We want to offer an alternative resolution this year, an un-resolution actually: being less resolute. Now, if you go and look up the word "resolute" in the dictionary just to remind yourself exactly what this word is supposed to mean you will find, "admirably purposeful, determined, and unwavering." Which may bring one to wonder just how "resolute" we generally are in our "resolutions" anyway?

This new year, you are invited to purposely be less resolute as your resolution. This will require you to slow down and check yourself often, but that time and space just might be enough for God to be able to get your attention.


#### **Greetings from Outreach!**
